In-school barriers	
A.	Progress in reading for disadvantaged pupils is lower than for others
External barriers <i>(issues which also require action outside school, such as low attendance rates)</i>	
B.	Complex family and home life issues impacting on attainment in school
C.	Low income preventing opportunities for remote learning
